All the staff thought their manners and behaviour were exemplary. A special well done to class 1 as this was your very first school trip.



### Writing For Pleasure

A year ago Mrs Edwards launched a new initiative to our writing curriculum, so that we provide the children with opportunities to write with more freedoms and not worry that their work will be under scrutiny and then they will be asked to edit. Instead we appreciate the children's creativity and encourage them to express their own passions, in a format that suits them.



This time our whole school theme was "Moz The Monster", which is the accompanying book to the John Lewis Advert. This stimulus has enabled each class to explore the themes and issues in a different way. The work produced has been very creative and imaginative and has thoroughly been enjoyed by everyone. We shall be putting some of the work in our display book, which is in the corridor for you to share.

It is innovative approaches such as these which enable The Meadows to have such outstanding writing results. For two years on the run, the strong progress our children make in writing, places us in the top 5% of schools nationally.

### Sports Competition

On Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> November, a team of children from Y5 and Y6 represented our school in an athletics competition at Newcastle Academy. They competed against 6 other local schools in a range of track and field events. All pupils participated in two track and two field events in order to earn points. At the end, the winning team was the team which had earned the most points in total.

During the course of the competition, the children certainly demonstrated characteristics of an athlete. They applied the skills that they had learnt in lessons, demonstrated high levels of fitness and worked well as part of a team. They also showed how much they have developed in our new Secret of Success - 'To Compete'. They were determined to succeed, pushed themselves to achieve their potential as well as showed a competitive spirit. They were great sports and encouraged their team mates to do their very best. Overall we came 4<sup>th</sup> out of 7 teams.

We were also given the task of presenting a sample of work that was produced in PSHE lessons. We also spoke about how we help children who need to reflect upon bad choices, so next time they can make a different decision.*

## **Catering Changes**

In the New Year, the school will have a new catering provider. The Meadows is part of a group of schools who have joined together to procure this service collectively. This achieved Best Value for all the schools. Following a statutory full tender process, the contract has been awarded to Alliance in Partnership. Whilst the service with Mellors, over the past four years has been positive, they were not successful this time. Alliance in Partnership were selected primarily, because they have the highest standards for food ingredients, spending far more than their competitors. They have achieved the prestigious Food for Life Gold status. One noticeable change the children will see straight away is that we will be moving to plates and dishes immediately, rather than the flight trays. It is good news for you as they have fixed the price for the next 3 years at £2.15 per meal. This is 15p per day cheaper than the standard cost in primary schools. During the tender process, I did sample a wide selection of their food, which was delicious I must say. Next week we will be sending home the new menus and other further information.
